This week we will hear from Maja and Limia of Tapestri, a non-profit organization dedicated to creating opportunities for immigrant and refugees survivors of violence through education, community organizing, direct services, and advocacy to help them reclaim ownership over their lives! President Jack has selected Tapestri as the recipient of the money we donate to honor our speakers for the coming year - and we will have an opportunity in the next week or two to assemble backpacks for students who are benefiting from Tapestri's services.

Maja is the Anti-Human Trafficking Program Director, designing and providing trainings and outreach on human trafficking on a local, state-wide, and national basis to mainstream service providers, law enforcement, and community organizations. She holds a Master's in International Relations and a Bachelor's degree in Political Science from Georgia State University.

Limia is Tapestri's Domestic Violence Program Director. With the organization since 2009, Limia currently manages program coordinators and conducts multicultural training programs for court personnel, Law enforcement and immigrant communities. She coordinates the Interpreter training and maintains the database for interpreters as well. She has a Bachelor of Art in Sociology and a Master's in Public Administration with a concentration on non-profit management from Kennesaw State University

**A Little More About FODAC Equipment Pick-Up:  
Saturday, August 5**



For the last several years, Dunwoody has participated in the DeKalb Rotary Council's annual FODAC (Friends of Disabled Adults and Children) equipment drive. This year, the event will take place Saturday, August 5! The group will meet at the back patio of the 57th Restaurant, which is located next to PDK Airport on Clairmont Road in Chamblee, at 8:30 AM on Saturday August 5th where we provide breakfast and drinks for the volunteers and give everyone a few minutes to socialize before heading out to pick up equipment about 9 or 9:30. Everyone is usually done between 1 and 2. We would love to have anyone that is interested in volunteering join us. This is a really good hands on project and is also a good project to bring prospective members to as well.

The Council will be looking for more trucks, trailers and volunteers to help collect donations. It's a good hands-on project and a great way to introduce prospective members to Rotary as they get to contribute, see the results of their efforts and interact with Rotarians from several clubs.

Over the years, this project has collected approximately \$1,800,000 worth of durable medical equipment from local residents and businesses in the metro Atlanta area that is refurbished and redistributed to those in need in our community by FODAC.
