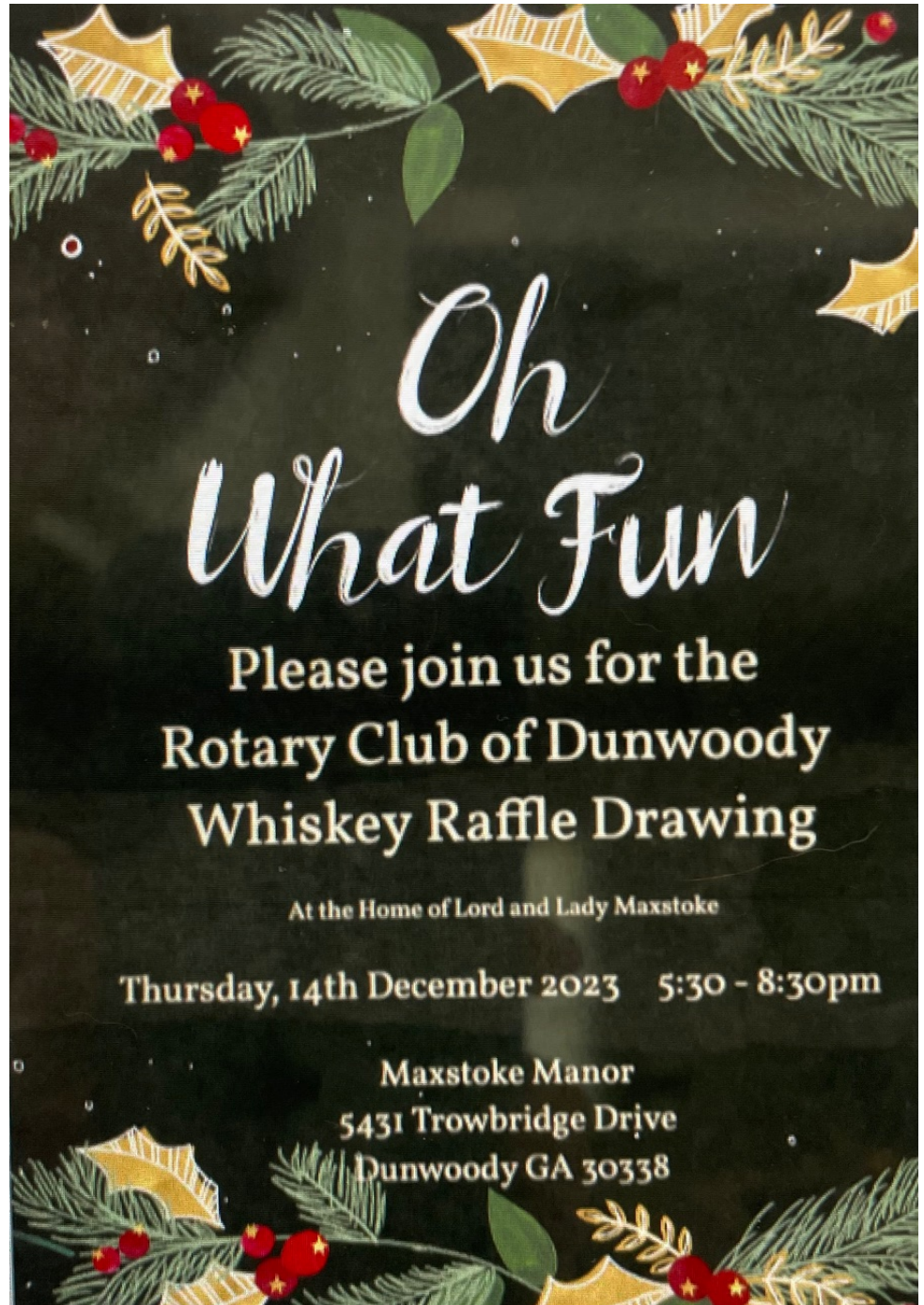

**It's Almost Time to Judge Essays!**



## THE GEORGIA ROTARY CLUBS LAWS OF LIFE ESSAY CONTEST

As we head into 2024, the Georgia Laws of Life Essay Contest is gearing up for judging essays! As a sponsoring club, our Rotarians are invited and encouraged to sign up now. Many of us have judged in the past and can vouch for this amazing opportunity - it gives you a window into the experiences that are shaping and inspiring our young people.

### **What's involved in judging?**

- Essay Judges in teams of two are assigned 30 to 48 essays from one or more high schools.
- It should take about three hours of your time to read and score assigned essays over a one-week period.
- All scoring should be submitted 48 hours before your Team Meeting.
- On the day of your Team Meeting, teams use GoTo to meet with a volunteer team lead to select school-level winners and Honorable Mentions.

### **How do you sign up?**

- Fill out the [Volunteer Sign-Up Form](#) at your earliest convenience. There you will indicate your training option and find the link to the Essay Judge Team Meeting Sign Up Genius.
- Once completed, you will receive a Google calendar invite for your training session. We expect everyone to attend the training. If you cannot attend, a recording of the training session will be made available following the session.
