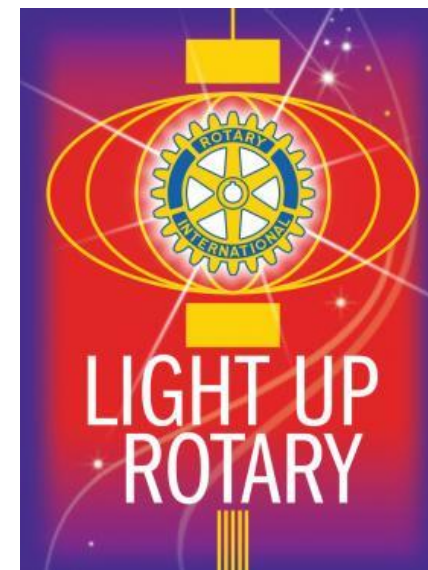

Jamie Laval, the U.S. National Scottish Fiddle Champion creates rapt audiences with his passionate performances of traditional music of Scotland, Ireland, Brittany & Quebec, blending an ancient art form with stunning virtuosity and contemporary flair that resonates with families, youth, seniors, and devotees of ethnic, jazz, & classical music. Considered one of North America’s finest practitioners of traditional Scottish music, Jamie performed on Dave Matthews’ platinum album *Some Devil* and gave a private performance for Her Majesty the Queen. A native of Seattle and a graduate of the Victoria Conservatory of Music in Canada, Jamie now tours the U.S. and Scotland. When not on the road, he divides his

Past President Bill Callaway reminded members of the Stop Hunger Now service project being held March 11th at the First Presbyterian Church.



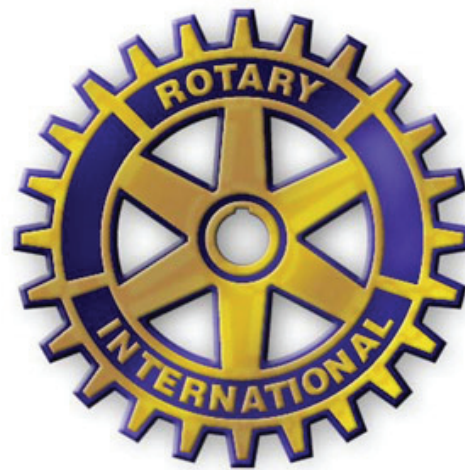
