Tim's campaign focused on consumer protection, clean energy and accountability. He travels the state speaking to students, civic groups and businesses about the importance of the PSC's responsibilities especially providing accountability to those the agency regulates.

Commissioner Echols has been outspoken about Georgia's nuclear waste – still sitting on both sites. He supports a Heritage Foundation plan that would privatize the reprocessing and disposal of commercial nuclear "material." Believing if the space program can be privatized, the certainly, nuclear waste disposition can too.

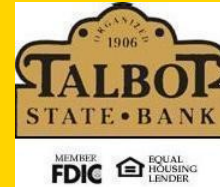
Tim has three degrees from the University of Georgia and still makes his home in Athens with his wife Windy and their seven children.
